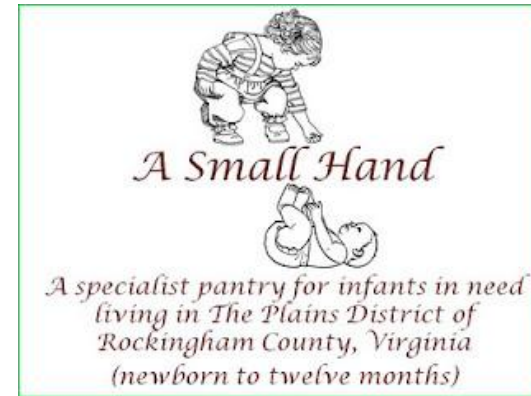

As a congregation, we will be collecting **donation items for A Small Hand infant pantry during the month of February**. Below is a list of suggested items you may shop for and bring to our church where we will collect the items and present them to the pantry at the end of the month.

There is a detailed description of the services A Small Hand provides as well as the requirements needing to be met to receive their services, posted on the bulletin board in the foyer.

ASmall Hand serves: Infants and toddlers in need in the Broadway Area School District on the 3rd Thursday of every month from 5-7pm. They are located in the Radar Lutheran Church building in Timberville.

(If you know of someone that could use their help, please encourage them to give a call-578-3658. They like to know who's coming so they have the proper formula on hand.)

Items needed and distributed on a regular basis:

Infant formula – usually Similac Advantage or generic equivalent
Specialty formulas – Enfamil Nutramigen,
Enfacare and Similac Neo-Sure
Baby Foods – Stage 2
Baby Cereal – Rice and Oatmeal
Diapers – Sizes Preemie, Newborn, 1 and 2
Baby Wipes – 80 count packages
Baby Wash/Shampoo
Sippy cups
Desitin and A & D Ointment
Baby clothing – Onesies, socks, bibs, clothing up to size 2T
Other items that aid in infant care (pacifiers, etc.)
